

Thrift Savings Plan

Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) maximum contribution amount for regular/Roth TSP is \$17,500 and \$5,500 for TSP Catch-Up. It is important to remember that TSP contributions are based on the calendar year in which the pay is received.

The first 2013 contribution will be on pay date January 10 (January 4 for DCMA). Therefore, those wishing to spread their contributions over the full 26 pay periods should make TSP and TSP Catch-Up elections during the pay period that begins on December 2.

TSP Catch-Up elections must be renewed each year. Eligibility for TSP Catch-Up are:

- * Age 50 or older during the calendar year,
- * Currently employed and in pay status and
- * Regular contributions to civilian or military TSP account or equivalent employer plan that will equal the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (\$17,500 for 2013).

Charts to assist with planning the amount of TSP contributions to reach the maximum for 2013 will be available on the ABC-C website (<https://www.abc.army.mil/>) beginning 2 December 2012.

Customs Office

The Hohenfels Customs Office is located in Bldg. 10, room 118. DSN 466-2745 / 2012 or 2042 (commercial 09472-83-2745 / 2012 or 2042). Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to noon and from 1 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. The customs office is closed on U.S. holidays and the first Thursday of the month. The military customs investigators are located in Bldg. 325 and can be reached at 466-4350 (commercial 09472-83-4350).

Customs clearance a must when selling cars in Germany

U.S. personnel can avoid big trouble by getting a customs "Permit to Transfer" when transferring a USAREUR-plated vehicle to a non-ID card holder in Germany. According to Fred Evans, chief of services at the USAREUR Customs Executive Agency in Heidelberg, it is essential to get a permit to transfer before you sell, donate or transfer a car to a German car dealer, junkyard or person who is not an ID card holder. This applies even if the vehicle was wrecked in an accident and you did not receive any money for it.

If you do not obtain this permit, you will eventually fail to clear vehicle registration when it is time to PCS. Customs authorities also may require you to prove what happened to the vehicle. This is obviously very difficult if the car was crushed long ago, you are in the middle of clearing out of Europe and you have no record of where the car went. If you cannot show what happened to the vehicle, you may be identified in a military police report and subject to disciplinary action.

The "Permit to Transfer" is available at the U.S. Forces customs office serving your garrison.
