These caverns were all hewn by hand with hammer and chisel and were used for fermentation and maturation of beer. During WWII the cellars were converted into public air raid shelters. The tour will visit a portion of the maze and the brewery. Afterwards we will have time to enjoy the home-brewed specialty beer and regional home cooking. After lunch we will head over to the Imperial Castle of Nurnberg for a tour of the most important imperial castles of the Holy Roman Empire.
