Mr. Wesley D. Potter was assigned as United States Army Garrison Hohenfels Deputy to the Garrison Commander on 27 Sep 2010.

Mr. Potter began his military service in 1974 as an enlisted Soldier with 10th Special Forces Group (ABN, USAR) in Spokane, Washington. While there, he entered the ROTC program at Eastern Washington University in Spokane, Washington. In 1978 he was commissioned as a Medical Service Corps Officer and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration.



After completing the Medical Service Corps Basic Course, his first duty assignment was with the 2/9 Cavalry Squadron, where he served as the Medical Platoon Leader.

In 1980 he was selected for Army Aviation flight training. After completion, he flew with DUSTOFF units in Korea, Ft. Sam Houston, Ft. Carson, Ft. Rucker, Honduras and Japan. During his assignments, he had two commands: Medical Clearing Company and MEDEVAC Company.

Mr. Potter retired from military service in 1995 and began his civilian service in 1996 as a strategic plans specialist with US Army, Japan. In 2002 he began work with the newly established US Army Installation Management Agency as an operations officer with US Army Garrison, Japan. In 2004 he was selected for an operations specialist position with Installation Management Command, Pacific Region, followed by promotions to Region Director of Emergency Services and Chief of Operations for the IMCOM Pacific Region.
